28th Annual Reunion, 07-12 November 2020

I'll get straight to the point. Our scheduled reunion is on. I have received notes from some highly respected members of our 2/9 Network urging us to cancel and a couple of others have emailed me indicating they will not be coming to this year's reunion. Their point is obviously the danger presented by this Covid-19 virus. I share some concerns and Henry Ostaszewski, my partner in crime in running the reunions, and I have had a couple of lengthy conversations about this. We have both had conversations with other 2/9 Network members from Vietnam who are just as convinced we should carry on with the reunion. Their concern is they do not know if they will make it to the next reunion. They want to see the men they served with, they want to visit their friends on The Wall, they want the reunion to go forward. Henry and I agreed to watch things very closely between now and the beginning of October. At that time we'll make a final decision, but right now are planning on having the reunion.

Attendance is something folks will have to make an individual choice about.

I've communicated a few times with our reunion hotel, the Marriott Residence Inn Rosslyn, in Arlington. Current restrictions in place in the hotel include a requirement to wear a mask while moving anywhere around the hotel – in corridors, on elevators, in the main lobby, etc. The conference room that we use as a hospitality room is open for us but we'll have to limit the number of people in there at one time. Breakfast is part of our contract and they are serving breakfast in a grab-n-go style where you pick up your breakfast and go back to your room. The Marine Corps still has the Birthday Wreath Laying Ceremony on the calendar for 10 November at 1000 hours. Today the National Museum of the Marine Corps announced the museum will be reopening effective 08 September with certain restrictions. The Key Bridge Marriott Hotel has hosted our Marine Corps Birthday Dinner on 10 November for several years now. They are still closed while undergoing major renovations. It does not appear likely we will be having our dinner there this year. It is also going to be very difficult to find someplace else that would be able to host our dinner. Henry and I decided that even if we have to go back to the "old days" of reunions when we had pizza parties at the Virginian Suites Hotel we are going to do everything possible to have a Birthday Dinner of some type. As of yesterday, 01 September, we had 33 rooms booked at the Residence Inn. Normally at this time we are pushing 70 or more reservations. We'll have a smaller crowd.
